A Prelude for Easter Morning,

With the realization of the resurrection, the music swells and leads to the melody for "O Sons and Daughters, Let Us Sing" (Hymn 255). Last, a triumphant statement of the theme recalling Christ's words "My peace be with you here. Alleluia!"
