<b>Session 1</b> January 2, 2022 <i>Christmas 2</i> Ephesians 1:3–14	Acknowledging our identity as the people of God, we will ponder ways to live a faithful life of praise.
<b>Session 2</b> January 9, 2022 <i>Baptism of the Lord</i> Luke 3:15–17, 21–22	We will affirm God’s promises begun in baptism and lived out in prayer.
<b>Session 3</b> January 16, 2022 <i>Epiphany</i> John 2:1–11	Through exploring Jesus’ sign of changing water into wine, we will commit to working for an abundant life for all.
<b>Session 4</b> January 23, 2022 <i>Epiphany 2</i> Luke 4:14–21	We will commit to ways to be agents of transformation.
<b>Session 5</b> January 30, 2022 <i>Epiphany 3</i> Luke 4:21–30	Learning from Jesus’ rejection by his hometown, we will consider ways to respond to his challenging and liberating words.
<b>Session 6</b> February 6, 2022 <i>Epiphany 4</i> Luke 5:1–11	We will envision acts of contemporary discipleship that echo Luke’s account of Jesus bidding disciples to venture into deeper waters.
<b>Session 7</b> February 13, 2022 <i>Epiphany 5</i> Luke 6:17–26	We will articulate implications for witness and discipleship evoked by the blessings and woes pronounced by Jesus in Luke 6.
<b>Session 8</b> February 20, 2022 <i>Epiphany 6</i> Luke 6:27–38	We will imagine ways in which Jesus’s radical words about loving enemies can empower us to live with such grace.
<b>Session 9</b> February 27, 2022 <i>Transfiguration</i> Luke 9:28–36, (37–43a)	On Transfiguration Sunday, we will discuss and practice ways of “hearing Jesus” in our walk of discipleship.

<b>Session 1</b> March 6, 2022 <i>Lent 1</i> Luke 4:1–13	Heeding Jesus’ response to his testing in the wilderness, we will commit to Lenten practices to strengthen our faith.
<b>Session 2</b> March 13, 2022 <i>Lent 2</i> Luke 13:31–35	Through Jesus’ lament over Jerusalem, we will name today’s death-dealing powers and reaffirm a vision of God’s realm.
<b>Session 3</b> March 20, 2022 <i>Lent 3</i> Luke 13:1–9	We will examine the nature of God’s mercy and seek ways to be more fruitful disciples.
<b>Session 4</b> March 27, 2022 <i>Lent 4</i> Luke 15:1–3, 11b–32	We will enumerate the astonishing ways God demonstrates love and mercy and will commit to embracing all of God’s children.
<b>Session 5</b> April 3, 2022 <i>Lent 5</i> John 12:1–8	We will ponder the extravagance of Mary of Bethany’s and Jesus’ gifts and practice ways to give and receive this extravagant love.
<b>Session 6</b> April 10, 2022 <i>Palm/Passion</i> Luke 19:28–40; 23:1–49	We will consider the meaning of Jesus as Lord and King and commit to examining our own expectations of Jesus during Holy Week.
<b>Session 7</b> April 17, 2022 <i>Easter Sunday</i> Luke 24:1–12	We will experience Luke’s account of the women’s testimony about the empty tomb and respond by witnessing to new life.  <i>Easter Sunday - No Class</i>
<b>Session 8</b> April 24, 2022 <i>Easter 2</i> John 20:19–31	Encountering how Thomas and other disciples responded to the risen Lord, we will experience ways Jesus empowers us to witness.
<b>Session 9</b> May 1, 2022 <i>Easter 3</i> John 21:1–19	We will describe authentic faith as both understanding and acting.
<b>Session 10</b> May 8, 2022 <i>Easter 4</i> Acts 9:36–43	Exploring the role of Tabitha’s community in her miraculous raising, we will identify the marks of a healing community today.
<b>Session 11</b> May 15, 2022 <i>Easter 5</i> Acts 11:1–18	As the early church in Acts 11 resisted change and yet transformed, we will explore new avenues for embracing change.
<b>Session 12</b> May 22, 2022 <i>Easter 6</i> Acts 16:9–15	Following the examples of Lydia and Paul, we will commit to practices of hospitality toward God and others.  <i>Last Class - Term Ends</i>
