You know us fully.



Hymn 610: This text comes from an 18-stanza hymn the author wrote to mark the first anniversary of his lifechanging conversion experience. It is now customarily the first hymn in Methodist hymnals worldwide. This tune, adapted from a German composer, is the usual North American setting.

*PRAYER OF CONFESSION



During the gathering hymn, children are invited to come forward.




At this time, potty-trained threes to kindergarteners are welcome to proceed to the hallway with an adult and sign into Worship and Wonder.
