GUIDELINES

Please limit your application to no more than three (3) pages exc. financial and board information.

1. 501(c)3 forms

- **a.** First time applicants or those who did not apply last year, please respond to the questions about your 501(c)3 status and send a copy of your IRS letter of determination.
- **b. 2022 grant recipients,** you do not need to send a duplicate IRS letter of determination unless there has been a change in your status.

2. Financial Information

- **a. 2023 Budget** should show sources of **Income /Amount**, i.e. Donations, Government Grants/Loans, Fees for Service, etc., and **Expenses/Amount**, i.e., Salaries, Benefits, Rent, Client Services, Supplies, etc.) *These are only examples*. **List your line items**.
- **b.** If your budget will not be approved by the above deadline, please notify Brenda Harris and provide an estimated date of completion.
- **c.** Please send your **latest monthly Budgeted Income & Expense Statement**. This is to show your income and expenses year-to-date. This is not your audited year-end financial statement.

3. Grants

Most grants are in the \$1,000-\$2,500 range with a few in the \$3,000-\$5,000 range; the maximum grant is \$5000.

4. Board Information

Please include a list of your board members and, if possible, their affiliations (where they work, community volunteer, etc.).
