#### **Narrative Lectionary**

This Lectionary provides a unique avenue for listening to the many different voices within Scripture.

# Lent Series: Parables That Prepare Us

In the early church, the season leading up to Easter was used by some Christians as a time of preparation to enter the Paschal mystery of baptism: Christ has died. Christ has risen. Christ will come again. During Lent, we will prepare ourselves to live into the same mystery by exploring five parables that Jesus shared in the days leading up to his crucifixion.
