






Before we can know God, God knows us. Baptism is





Jesus tells this parable to his disciples to prepare them for the days ahead when their faith will be tested. The story depicts how the disciples are to demonstrate their faithfulness as they anticipate the return of the Lord. This parable asks — what does faithfulness look like in a time of waiting?

My present day example steers away from financial "talents" and uses gardening. I have always loved to garden with my mom growing up. Something about waiting for sprouts to peek from the ground and the fantastical magic of a bud in bloom or a vegetable that gets plucked before the squirrel have a chance. To me, gardening has everything to do with faithfulness in light of this parable's parameters. Gardening takes time, devotion, and nurturing. And possibly most importantly, giving back to the earth when the time comes.
