

This text emphasizes the covenantal dimensions of baptism, most obvious in the baptism of children (though also present in the baptism of adults), including the worshiping community's commitment to acquaint children with salvation history and to learn from their humble trust.

We welcome children and adults into the fellowship of faith. The congregation promises to guide, nurture, and love the baptized person.
