We see only the deep sadness of the world, and do not notice your people at work amid the sorrow.


We assume that things will never get better, and do not see all that is good right now.

Help us to grow in love and trust, in compassion and hope, so that as the Christ child comes to us once again, we will see him, and know him, and rejoice.




