Jesus Heals - Sermon Series: February

Throughout February, the Narrative Lectionary will focus our study on the Gospel of Luke. In the assigned passages, Jesus heals three different people and raises a young man from the dead. Our series will invite us to grapple with the healing power of Jesus in scripture and to imagine how that healing power is still at work in our lives and the world.

The Seven Last Words of Jesus - Lent Sermon Series: March 9 - April 13

In many Christian traditions, the seven last words (or sayings) of Jesus are read during worship on Good Friday. By broadening the tradition to a Lenten sermon series, we will allow more space to examine each saying and appreciate the depth of Jesus' sacrifice on the cross. Jesus' words spoken through the pain and anguish of the crucifixion will shape our journey to the cross and our experience of the resurrection miracle.

Stephen Class: Room 301

This Winter-Spring term we will continue our study of short stories. We will finish reading stories in the collection, *A Swim in the Pond in the Rain*, in which four Russians give a master class on writing, reading, and life, George Saunders, editor. We will begin to read stories from the collection, *God Stories*, edited by C. Michael Curtis, an editor for the Atlantic Monthly.

Class members facilitate discussion of the short stories. We will alternate between the three remaining Russian short stories and the stories in *God Stories*. There are no prerequisites except for a love of reading and a willingness to discover with others how a short story read in common and discussed in a class can lead us to consider "the big questions." A detailed schedule will be available before the Winter-Spring Term begins.

Tapestry: Contemplative Prayer Experience: Harlan Room

Explore a tapestry of contemplative practices that require focus and attention while our minds are busy analyzing, asking questions, pondering, or listening. We weave lectio, visio, musica, and walking divina prayer practices through ancient and contemporary texts. If you're unfamiliar with one or more of these, come and learn something new! Class begins promptly at 9:40 and drop-in visitors are welcome!

We welcome local scholars to teach the Bible in its contexts: the stories, the writers, and as Christians today. We also study history and current event topics that are closely related to these Biblical lessons.

Adult Forum Presentation: February 2 | 9:40 am

Join us to hear from Rev. Dr. Victor Aloyo, President of Columbia Theological Seminary. All adult classes will join the forum!

Grief Management Workshop: February 13 and February 27 | 6:30 pm | Montgomery Hall Throw out any ideas you have about a grief group. This is not that! This is experiential and focused on our joy, hope, and wholeness. Angela Kelly, LCSW Administrator Baptist Centers for Good Grief, will lead two sessions to teach tools for healthy processing of our grief to claim our joy and wholeness. The first session will be an introduction for those who are newly grieving and a reminder to all as to key concepts for processing our grief in a healthy and hopeful way. The second program, "Coping With Grief Through Journaling", will share various journaling techniques, how they help with grief, and then provide an opportunity to do some hands-on practices to experience the power of journaling.

Sacred Ground: Meetings begin in January

This film and readings-based dialogue series on race, grounded in faith will walk through chapters of America's history of race and racism while weaving in threads of family story, economic class, and political and regional identity. This small group opportunity is open to all, and especially designed to help white people talk with other white people. IPC's worship services with the sharing of Church archives associated with the event. This will include
an "easy" lunch that attendees will eat while the intro 10-15 minutes of "lecture" will occur. Lunch will
be followed by independent study of various documents around the room and then we will come
together at the conclusion for 10-15 minutes of discussion.

Lenten Lectionary Groups: Beginning after Ash Wednesday, March 5 Lenten Lectionary Groups will return for 2025! Small group participants will spend one hour together each week in prayerful consideration and discussion of the scripture that will be the basis of the following Sunday's sermon. 
